

Regular meeting of November 2, 1961

The Western Dubuque County Community School Board met in regular session on Thursday November 2, 1961 at the office of the district at 8 P. M.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read, they were approved as so read.

A motion by Deutmeyer that: Superintendent Drexler be authorized to attend the American Association of School Administrators Convention in February with expenses paid, motion seconded by Recker, carried unanimously.

At this time the bond opinion of Chapman and Cutler was presented: This opinion in it's entirety is as follows:

Oct. 24, 1961

We hereby certify that we have examined certified copy of the proceedings of the Board of Directors of the Western Dubuque County Community School District, in Dubuque, Jackson, Jones and Delaware Counties, Iowa, passed preliminary to the issue by said School District of its School Building Bonds to the amount of \$1,345,000, dated September 1, 1961, denomination \$1000, numbered from 1 to 1345, inclusive, of which bonds numbered 1 to 330, inclusive, bear interest at the rate of Two and three -quarters per cent per annum, bonds numbered 331 to 595, inclusive , bear interest at the rate of Three per cent per annum, bonds numbered 596 to 1070, inclusive, bear interest at the rate of Three and one-quarter per cent per annum, and bonds numbered 1071 to 1345, inclusive, bear interest at the rate of Three and

three eighths per cent per annum, due serially and in numerical order on November 1 of each of the years 1962 to 1980, inclusive, and we are of the opinion that such proceedings show lawful authority for said issue under the laws of the State of Iowa now in force.

We further certify that we have examined examined executed bond number one and find the same in due form of law and in our opinion said issue, to the amount named, is valid and legally binding upon said Western Dubuque County Community School District and all taxable property in said School District is subject to the levy of taxes sufficient to pay the same without limitation as to rate.

The statement in the amount of \$1,500.00 from Chapman and Cutler was presented, a motion by Deutmeyer that this bill be allowed, seconded by Recker, motion carried unanimously.

The quit claim deed from the town of Cascade for the following real estates received:

All of the alley North of and adjacent to Lot 163 in Union Addition to East Cascade in the Town of Cascade, Dubuque County Iowa.

A check in the amount of \$50.00 to be forwarded to the town of Cascade for costs involved in this transaction. Also a fee of \$200.00 due Mr. Frank Less for services in connection with this statement.

A bill received from Cullen-Schiltz and Associates for inspection of grading and staking grades for contractors, also included was a statement from Warzyn Engineering Co. for \$2,253.78. This statement from Cullen-Schiltz in the total amount of \$4,174.14. The bill to be tabled for the present.

A change order on the Dyersville Kindergarten School received. This change order no 1 is under the General Work contract.

A motion by Deutmeyer, seconded by Recker that this change order be authorized. Motion carried unanimously.

Mention made of the State School Board Convention in Des Moines on November 16 and 17. Plans are being made by the board members of the district to attend.

The project of trimming trees at the Dyersville and Cascade school sites discussed, a final decision on the awarding of this work to be decided later.

Superintendent Drexler reported the following school sites had been disposed of:

Carroll Site:

Part of the North East Quarter of Section Eleven, Township Eighty nine, North of Range Two West of the Fifth Principal Meridian, measuring from the South East Corner along Section Ten, west twenty-seven chains and fifty links to corner of Mocks land, thence west twenty one chains, and fifty-eight links to a post at the north east corner of said lot thence south thirty one west, three hundred sixty eight links to a stone set in at road angle, thence north nineteen and one fourth degrees, west three hundred eighty five links to the corner of Mocks land, thence east three hundred and fifty links to starting point, containing forty-six one hundredths acres (46/100).
