Regular Meeting of May 3rd, 1962

The regular meeting of the Western Dubuque County Community School District was held on Thursday eve. May 3rd, 1962 at the office of the district in Farley. Meeting called to order at 8 P. M. by President Driscoll

Minutesof the last regular meeting and special meeting of April 13, 1962 read. There being no corrections or additions they were approved as so read.

Mr. Hampton Hall, who is in charge of the vocational agricultural program with the State Department of Public Instruction met with the board at this time. Mr. Hall gave much valuable information on this program stating it is primarily a local program, not State of Federal, and the program hopes to render the service of training for an occupation in the agricultural field.

A motion by Recker that change order no 1 with Freeman Electric in the amount of a  $\neq$  \$79.50 be allowed, motion seconded by Scherrman and carried unanimously.

A motion by Scherrman that change order no 3 with Frey Construction Co. in the amount of a + \$67.00 be allowed. Motion seconded by Deutmeyer and carried unanimously.

Correspondence read from the architectural firm of Durrant and Bergquist stating that the final inspection for the Dyersville kindergarten school had been set as May 18, 1962.

Superintendent Drexler told the Board he had been advised by the Epworth City Council that the sewer extension to the site of the new junior-senior high school was being given immediate attention.
