## Classroom Spotlight

## 1st Grade

Welcome to First Grade!

This year is off to a great start! Both first grade classes are enjoying our morning meetings—greeting our friends, reading a daily message, doing a fun group activity, and sharing time! We have found that this is a fun way to start and end our day of learning! During this morning time we have been learning all about Cougar Pride what it looks like and sounds like for first graders. We are learning how to show Cougar Pride in and out of the classroom.

In reading we have started reading centers—we work in small groups on reading, writing and word work (sight words, phonics, and Magic Rime). We also carry over our whole group literacy comprehension lessons to independent work/ practice at centers. This allows the students a chance to apply what they learn from our whole group lessons. We have also been doing a lot of writing—working on complete sentences, starting with a capital letter and adding that end mark.

In math we have been learning a lot about addition and subtraction, counting up and back on a number paths and number grids and we have been working with data charts-asking and answering questions using tallies. We have started our unit on measurement and are learning how to measure objects to measure length.

In writing we are starting to write small moment stories things that have happened to them or things they have done. We are focusing on how to write a story using beginning, middle and end.

We are looking forward to a great year of learning how to do many things but most importantly we can't wait to learn how to become better readers and writers! Don't forget to read a little bit each day!


#### Where to find the PTO Meeting Minutes?



### Nurse's Corner

We are past the time of scary goblins, ghosts, vampires and zombies but now entering an even scarier time of colds, flu, temps and vomiting! Oh my!!!

Quite frequently students complain of different symptoms and it can be difficult to determine whether you should keep them home from school or send them. Following are some guidelines to help you determine what the best choice might be for your child...

**Temperature:** 100.4 and above is considered a temperature per updated CDC recommendations. Students should stay at home for 24 hours once temp-free without the aid of Tylenol/Ibuprofen.

**Vomiting:** You can go hours without vomiting if you haven't eaten, but as soon as you eat or drink you can get sick again...so don't return to school until they are able to drink liquids and eat solid food without vomiting.

Coughing: This is most likely the hardest symptom to determine, we all know a cough from Bronchitis or a cold can last for weeks and we don't want students out that long! If they feel okay and the cough is only occasional then they can return to school. If they just don't seem to be able to stop coughing please keep them home.

**Diarrhea:** Please keep students' home until 24 hours after the last loose stool.

**Pain:** When a student complains of a sore knee or mild headache, its just fine to give some Tylenol/Ibuprofen and send to school. Students who complain of pain which is more than mild or minor should stay at home to be monitored.
