Kindergarten has been working hard in science, where they just started an investigation of the world's biggest plant: trees! Kindergarteners have observed many different trees in Cascade and are learning about the parts of a tree, different tree shapes, and what trees need to grow. Each kindergarten class will even 'adopt' a tree in our schoolyard to observe throughout the year and watch as it changes with the upcoming seasons.

Cascade Elementary School worked throughout the summer to update our hard surface playing area to help make recess more fun and accessible for all grade levels in our school.
