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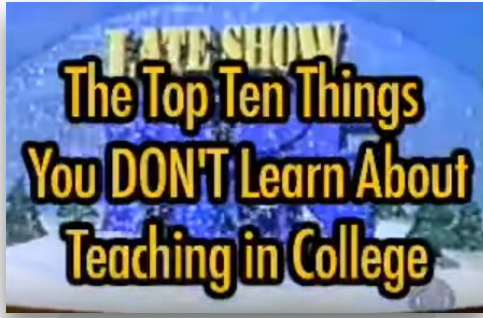

Microsoft Word Tips & Tricks



* Make changes to a Word document quickly without changing your original. If you have recently worked on a Word document, this will work. Click on **File > Open > Recent Documents**. Look for the filename of the document you want to change. Right-click on the filename and select **Open a copy**. Any changes you make are saved to the copy... not the original. Big time saver!

* Rather than cutting and pasting in Word, try this: Select any block of text and then press **F2**. You will see at the way bottom of your screen, **Move to where**. Simply place the cursor at the location you want to move your highlighted block of text and press **Enter**. Tah-dah! The selection has now been moved. Very cool.

Microsoft PowerPoint Tips & Tricks



* Create a Custom Template for your project:

1. Select the Themes tab.
2. On the far right side, click Edit Master, and then Slide Master.
3. Edit the template as you see fit. You can do pretty much whatever you want.
4. Click Close Master. This will change all current and future slides to the one you just created.

* Make your title stand out on your slide:

1. Right click on the text you want to format and click on Format Text Effects.
2. There are a bunch of formatting options that will open on the right side for you to use. Experiment to your heart's content!
3. Many times, if you "lay" your title over the top of a graphic, your slide will have a more professional look than just having it hang in the air.
4. Make sure the font you use is easy to read.

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
