All a teacher needs to do is copy the URL from the YouTube video the teacher wants to show to the class, paste it into **SafeShare.tv**, click the Generate Safe View button, submit the video, and then copy the new URL. There will be no ads to worry about and the teacher can even do some minor editing to help remove any questionable content.

TunesToTube allows you to take any of your audio files and convert them to a "video" that can be uploaded to YouTube. No more needing to use a movie editing program to do the conversion!



Chinese (Mandarin) - sanyu; Danish - marts; French - mars; Italian - marzo; Latin -Martius; Spanish - marzo


Historical Names: Roman: Martius Saxon: Hrethmonath Germanic: Lenz-mond (Springtime month)
